Rosary Series

A beautiful 5-inch patch is available for each activity. The Rosary has five activities: Pray the Rosary; Joyful Mysteries; Luminous Mysteries; Sorrowful Mysteries; and Glorious Mysteries.

The Rosary Series focuses on How to Pray the Rosary and the Mysteries of the Holy Rosary. This is an opportunity for youth and adults to learn more about their faith. All youths and adults may work on this activity and earn the patch. This activity may be worked on individually or as a group. It is not necessary to send the completed form. An adult may verify the correct answers.

We are basing the dates for these patches on the Feast Days on the Church's calendar 2021.



Sorrowful Mysteries are unhappy and difficult times in Jesus' time on Earth. On February 13th, we will start this patch right before Lent, which will include The Scourging at the Pillar and The Crucifixion and Death.



Glorious Mysteries include the Ascension and Pentecost. We Will complete this patch between these two events on May 29th.



Luminous Mystery include the Baptism of the Lord and The Transfiguration. The Feast of Transfiguration is on August 6th, we can prepare we will be doing the Luminous mysteries on July 31st.



October is usually the month dedicated to the Rosary, the last patch is how to pray the Rosary, we will do this on October 23rd, for our Mother Mary.
